BOARD'S DISCUSSION ON CORRESPONDENCE: There were no discussions made on the correspondence.

VISITING OFFICIALS: There were no visiting elected officials present.

REPORTS OF BOARDS AND DEPARTMENT HEADS:

POLICE CHIEF JOHN RADER - Thank you, Mr. Supervisor. We're still accepting applications for the two summer sessions of the Junior Police Academy. Session one is July 13th to the 24th. Second session is August 3rd to the 14th. We do have several openings still in the sessions. We're going to be doing a push in the next couple weeks to try to fill those. If anyone needs information, they can contact the Police Department or just go to the website, which is www.wp.gov or www.wpdjpa.com

We received a letter from the U.S. Police K-9 Association that Officer Kerstner and K-9 Fritz successfully completed or certified nationally at the National Dog Trials from May 3rd to May 6th. This is a monumental achievement that requires the highest level of skill in countless hours. Prior to this event, they had already certified at the regional level in order to participate against the best of the best at the National Trials.

Our planning for National Night Out continues. The event is August 4th at Veterans Memorial Park from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. There will be participation from all our stakeholders throughout the town as well as food and entertainment from the Black Dirt Bandits.

As a reminder, road construction continues throughout the town. I know that's part of your report involving closed roads, single lanes, and long waits at border zones. We want people to continue to allow extra time in those areas. In addition to the work zones, our DPW crews are out working on enormous seasonal road maintenance projects. An extra push needs to be exercised when driving through those areas as well. We are seeing an increase in motor vehicle accidents that are involving extended road closures. We have one currently going on now at Route 17A coming into the Village of Warwick due to a down utility pole. We're looking for everyone to have a fun and safe summer here in Warwick.

Lastly, the annual Pride Parade is this Sunday, June 14th. That begins at 11:00 a.m. Residents can expect road closures and detours on Oakland Avenue, Main Street, High Street, and Forester Avenue to the entrance of Veterans Memorial Park during that time. That's all I have unless there's any questions.

SUPERVISOR DWYER - Do we have any questions for the Chief? Thank you, Chief. Congratulations on your recognition with the Youth Award. A great honor that you received. I don't recall the exact award, but it was from Orange County and it's because of your involvement with the community's youth and very well deserved. We're happy to see you up there getting a recognition.

POLICE CHIEF RADER - Thank you, sir.

DPW COMMISSIONER BENJAMIN ASTORINO – All right. As Chief Rader mentioned, our crews are out on their annual summer, spring road work prepping our roads. We did some catch basin work at Panorama Drive. We vacced all the basins and checked all of those. Drainage on Ackerman Road, we had that issue with the TAM vehicle. We built up that road edge for the guiderail to be reinstalled probably end of this month. Ditch work around East Ridge Road, ditching the roads there. We had some tree work we

took care of that. We have two road mowers out mowing every day town-wide. Pot holes we're out every day with patching with some hot mix. Road sweeper is out every day. Our vehicle maintenance is ongoing. Road signs we're replacing as needed.

Our parks are all open and being mowed and maintained. We also did a water job with the water department the other day and a curb box on Jersey Avenue.

WATER & SEWER, DEPUTY COMMISSIONER MATT MCPHERSON – Good evening, everyone. As usual, in the summertime, spent a lot of time in Indian Park in Greenwood Lake, keeping the summer system going. We made a few repairs on Deer Trail North, Deer Trail South, Stony Trail, and then we also, with the DPW's help, filled in a lot of spots where we had dumped debris to make repairs. So, we got a lot of patches done up there.

We excavated and repaired a broken curb box on Jersey Avenue to shut off a leaking year-round service line. The guys are getting ready to start reading the water meters again. We aim to start at the end of next week and go on to the final week of June. The guys will be going house-to-house in most of the water districts, including Wickham Village, Eurich Heights, and Bellvale. Plants and pump stations, wastewater plant, continue to be checked and maintained seven days a week. The guys, mowing grass, perform preventative maintenance at mow facilities. We collected and submitted all of our water and wastewater

sampling for the month of May, and regulatory reporting for the month of May has been completed and submitted as well.

SUPERVISOR DWYER – A lot of stuff going on. You guys are staying busy. Keep up the great work.

WATER & SEWER, DEPUTY COMMISSIONER MATT MCPHERSON – Thanks.

RECREATION DIRECTOR, SAM WALTER – Thank you, Supervisor. The pools are open now weekends only from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. until June 19th. That's when we open seven days a week, 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. I know people are anxious to get out to the pools every day, especially when it's starting to get really hot. We still have passes available at the clerk's office for the pools, and we are having a ribbon-cutting ceremony on June 24th at the pools, 11:00 a.m. Everyone's invited, but if you have a pass, you can swim. I hope you come out for the ribbon-cutting.

We also have registration open for our senior aqua fit class. It's free to residents that are 55 and older. If you go onto the Mountain Lake Park website, mtlakepark.com, or the town's website, there's links on both of those or Facebook to be able to register for the aqua fit class. But if you haven't had a chance to check out the pools, you should definitely come up and see them. They're beautiful, amazing. People are having a lot of fun in the new kiddie pool as well.

The rest of the park's been super busy. Folks have been coming out trying to find the hidden hollow trail, which is kind of hidden, but we're getting you there. It's basically down here around the pond, and they really like that.

We had a great food truck festival on June 4th. We had another food truck festival on July 2nd, so we hope you come out for that. And lastly, Pickleball has been super busy. We just finished our clinics, and now we go into our summer leagues that are happening. If you're interested in Pickleball, you can go on our Team Reach app, under Town of Warwick Mountain Lake Park Pickleball, or you can stop by the recreation office and borrow some paddles and balls and go play. That's it for my report.

TOWN BOARD REPORTS:

COUNCILMAN DEANGELO - Good evening. For the Warwick Valley Humane Society, they were recipients and participated in two fundraisers, the first annual Wiener Fest and Friends and Wrestling for the Love of our Shelter Pets. Both were wonderful events, and we thank the community for always supporting our shelter.

They have a wish list. Friskies, pâté, cat and kitten canned food, paper towels, small and large paper plates, 13-gallon scent-free garbage bags, medium-sized exam gloves, or visit <http://www.wvhumane.org> for your extended wish list on Chewy and Amazon. That's all we have for the Humane Society.

For the Town of Warwick Friendly Visitor Program. For May, they had number of neighbors assisted was 37, number of volunteers assisting those neighbors was 25, total number of services provided was 294, and the total number of hours provided by those volunteers was 206. That's all I have.

COUNCILMAN KOWAL - Thank you. Well, the Battery Storage Work Group, who is working on the ordinance for the town, has completed its work and handed over a draft ordinance to the town board and to the professionals. I'd like to thank everyone on the committee. We had a good amount of input. I think it took us about four months. We worked on it at meetings about four months. I think it's a fair ordinance. It covers the commercial and residential applications pretty fairly, and we submitted it to the town board for their approval.

On a lighter note, last Saturday, I was invited to bring the chain link that was on display here at town hall up to Greenwood Lake for the AUSA event that they had. It's an organization that's affiliated with the Army and the West Point Division of that organization. I didn't realize when they asked me to take it up there that it was going to be their centerpiece of their topic of their conversation that day.

SUPERVISOR DWYER - It was called the Great Chain Event.

COUNCILMAN KOWAL - Well, I should have mentioned that. It was a nice event. The chain plays an integral role in the Revolutionary War, and the entire chain was manufactured in our town back 250 years ago, so I think it's important that people be reminded of that. We're also going to be having it on display on a float on July 4th, so if anybody has a chance to come up to Greenwood Lake, keep an eye out for the Times and different information on that on the Greenwood Lake website, and hopefully it has good weather, and that'll be pretty much the cap for all the events that we have planned for the Historical Society and the Friends of Hathorn and the historian for this year. Thank you.

COUNCILMAN MATTINGLY - Thank you, Supervisor Dwyer. Updates for the Village of Warwick and our Chambers of Commerce. There'll be an Espresso Mixer at Rylex Custom Cabinetry, 636 County Route 1 in Pine Island on Friday, June 12th from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m., free for members, \$10 for future members.

The After Hours Mixer at Peach Grove House, 1572 New York 17A in Warwick is Tuesday, June 16th, 2026, starting at 5:30 p.m., \$10 for members, \$20 for future members.

Voters may also currently request an absentee or early mail ballot in person at the Orange County Board of Elections office located at 75 Webster Avenue, Goshen, New York, or apply online through the County website. The Board office will remain open until 8:00 PM on Monday, June 15, and Tuesday, June 16, and will be open both weekends during Early Voting from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM to assist voters with in-person ballot applications and other voting services.

SUPERVISOR DWYER - Just one comment about the early voting. So early voting, you do not have to be a resident of Warwick to vote at the Warwick Senior Center. Any resident in Orange County who is eligible to vote in that primary can vote at any polling location across the county. So coincidentally, there's a primary in the town of Chester. It is convenient for some residents of Chester to come to Warwick to vote and they may do so during early voting.

All right, my report. Good evening, everyone. I would like to begin with an update on several important projects and initiatives taking place throughout the Town of Warwick. First, regarding the ongoing New York State DOT roadway improvements, I am pleased to report that the Homestead Village box culvert project has been completed and that section of roadway is now fully reopened. The next major phase of the Route 94-17A project will be the closure between Larry's Deli and the Warwick Country Club beginning June 19th. Local access to residences and businesses will be maintained, but through traffic will be detoured. The previously announced Route 94 closure between the Village of Florida and Chester has been postponed by the New York State DOT and is now expected to take place next year. I am happy to finally announce that milling and paving operations will begin next week in our villages. Paving is scheduled from Railroad Avenue to Webster Bank, which is right near 3rd Street, in the Village of Warwick, and from Village Drive to Meadow Road near Central Deli in the Village of Florida. Please plan accordingly and expect some delays while crews are in the area working.

Turning to town paving, our 2026 paving program is scheduled to begin in July. Thanks to careful planning and budgeting, we will pave approximately 6.6 miles of roadway this year.

at a cost of roughly \$912,000. By comparison, in 2025 we paved 5.75 miles at a cost of approximately \$908,000. We continue to maximize every taxpayer dollar while improving our road network.

I would also like to remind residents that we will be presenting an update on the Jayne Street Bridge replacement project during Coffee with the Supervisor on Tuesday, June 16th at Mattingly's Tavern in the Village of Florida. A separate presentation will also be provided to the Village of Florida Village Board on June 17th at their official board meeting.

In Pine Island, the long awaited new well project is nearing completion. I feel like it's a broken record, but we're getting there. We are currently awaiting final approval from the New York State DEC and expect that well to be online within the next week, according to Matt. If it doesn't happen, we blame him. This project has been nearly five years in the making and represents a major investment in the future reliability of the Pine Island water system. Looking ahead, we intend to pursue grant funding to completely rebuild the Pine Island water treatment plant, which has been operating out of a temporary residential shed structure for more than five years.

Next week, representatives from Veregy Solutions will conduct a comprehensive audit of town-owned buildings. This no-cost energy assessment will identify opportunities to reduce utility costs, improve efficiency, and lower long-term operating expenses for our taxpayers. I'm also pleased to report that the town has submitted three major infrastructure projects to New York State's Intended Use Plan, commonly known as the IUP, positioning us for future grant funding opportunities. These projects include the Mountain Lake Park sewer project, the Pine Island water treatment plant project, and a comprehensive lead service line replacement program across all town water districts.

Expanding on what Councilman Kowal said, I would also like to provide an update on the town's battery storage system law. The town board continues to review the draft legislation developed following extensive research and recommendations from not only a volunteer committee, Deputy Supervisor Kowal, myself, along with our consultants and legal counsel. Once the board completes its review, the proposed law will be presented to the public through a formal public hearing process. In addition, we will seek comments and recommendations for both the Orange County Planning Department and the Town of Warwick Planning Board. Public input remains an important part of this process, and we encourage residents to participate when the proposal is formally introduced.

As temperatures begin to rise, I want residents to know that the Warwick Police Department has coordinated cooling stations located throughout the town. The Warwick Fire Department station on Church Street and the Pine Island Ambulance Corps building will serve as designated cooling stations. Anyone in need of assistance during periods of extreme heat should contact the Warwick Police Department, and they will help coordinate access to these facilities. I'm excited to announce that Orange County's largest free Senior Barbecue will return to Union Corners Park on August 18th, with a rain date of August 19th. This event is open exclusively to Town of Warwick residents, and informational flyers will be distributed through local senior organizations in the coming weeks.

Our next Coffee with the Supervisor will be held Tuesday, June 16th at 9:00 a.m. at Mattingly's Tavern in the Village of Florida. Coffee and light refreshments will be provided, and all residents are welcome to attend this free community event, which is not paid for by taxpayer dollars.

Finally, I would like to remind everyone that Flag Day is this Sunday. I encourage residents, businesses, and community organizations throughout Warwick to proudly display the American flag as we celebrate the enduring ideals and freedoms of the greatest nation on Earth. Thank you, and that concludes my report.


