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

Acceptable Items: Adhesives, Aerosol Cans, Automotive Products, Fire Extinguishers, Flammable Liquids (oil, gas, kerosene and/or mixtures), Corrosives/Cleaners, Creosote, Driveway Sealer, Pool Chemicals, Fluorescent Tubes, Inks, Mercury, **Oil Based Paints Only**, Pesticides/Herbicides, Propane Cylinders (camp size), Roofing Tar, Rubber Cement, Solvents/Thinners, Varnishes/Shellac/Stains, Wood Preservatives, Car Batteries.

NOT Accepted: Refrigerators, Tires, Air Conditioners, Electronics, **Latex (water based) Paint (see how to dispose of Latex Paint below)**, BBQ size Propane Tanks, Appliances, Single-Use Batteries (can be thrown in the household trash). Haz. Waste from Businesses NOT Accepted.

How to Dispose of Latex Paint: Remove the lid, put the paint can in a safe place away from children and animals and let the paint dry out. If there is a large quantity of paint in the can, line a cardboard box with a black garbage bag, pour the paint in the garbage bag and add cheap, clay kitty litter until the paint is solid. Once dried, throw the solid paint in your household trash.

CONDITIONALLY EXEMPT SMALL QUANTITY GENERATOR CERTIFICATION

I hereby certify that I am a generator of hazardous waste within the State of New York and that because of the small volume of hazardous waste generated and/or stored, I qualify for conditionally exempt small quantity generator status.

I understand that in order for conditionally exempt small quantity generator status, I must meet all three of the following conditions:

1. Generate less than 1 kg/month (2.2 pounds) of acute hazardous waste (as defined by 6 NYCRR Part 371), and never store more than this amount on site at any time; and
2. Generate less than 100 kg/month (220 pounds) of all other hazardous waste (as defined by 6 NYCRR Part 371), and never store more than 1000 kg/month on site at any time.
3. Transport a maximum of 220 lbs of hazardous waste at one time.

Only if I am a farmer, I realize that I may store up to 1000 kg. (2200 pounds) of non-acute hazardous waste pesticides on my farm without losing my conditionally exempt status, provided that these wastes are brought to a household hazardous waste collection program.

I further understand that if, in the future, I exceed the quantity limitations described above, I will become subject to additional regulation as a hazardous waste generator and will no longer be eligible to participate in this type of collection program.

I certify that I have the authority to make these statements on behalf of my farm or business. Also, I, the undersigned, do hereby certify that the items brought for collection came from my farm or business located in Orange County.





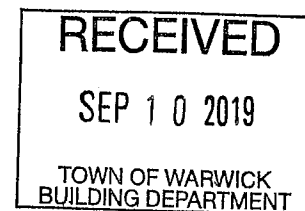

Dear Orange County Transfer Station Patron,

As you are aware, municipalities across the country have been reeling from the sudden increase in recycling costs due to China's ban on the importation of recyclables. This ban is a result of China no longer willing to accept the historically high rates of contaminated recyclables coming from the US. Unfortunately, the crisis caused by China's ban is tempting officials across the country to reconsider recycling as an effective materials management strategy, threatening over thirty years of progress in the successful implementation of curbside recycling programs. While markets are currently down, landfilling recyclables is not the solution as this will exacerbate the problem of ever dwindling landfill space in the US and only increase costs long-term.

Contamination adds cost to recycling and is mostly due to "Wisheycling", a habit of disposing of non-recyclable refuse into the curbside recycling bin. To proactively address the issue of contamination and the behaviors associated with it, the County is eager to partner in developing outreach strategies for your town, city, or village to make sure that the messaging of your curbside recycling programs is clear and adhered to by residents and businesses alike.

In addition, Orange County has released a Request for Bids (RFB) to evaluate any recycling and solid waste management scenarios available to it by the market in order to select the most cost-effective and compliant manner for the management of solid waste and recyclables. Please note that some of the scenarios that will be evaluated include the source separation of glass as well as converting to dual stream, where mixed paper and cardboard are to be handled separately from commingled containers. It is anticipated that contracts will be awarded in the fall of 2019.

Also note that the Newburgh Transfer Station will be suspending the acceptance of solid waste from commercial and municipal entities beginning in late 2019 to allow for the reconstruction of the facility. While the commercial and municipal side of the operation will be closed, residents will still be able to utilize the Citizens Drop-Off Area to bring single stream recycling, paper, tires, electronics, scrap metal and solid waste. The County is also in the process of designing and building a commercial food scraps composting facility which will mitigate additional waste management costs as well as assist the county in taking a step toward a more sustainable future.

The project will take approximately one (1) year and will involve closing the solid waste receiving portion of the facility. As an alternative, Newburgh transfer station customers may utilize our Orange County Transfer Station #1 (New Hampton Transfer Station) located at 21 Training Center Lane, New Hampton, NY.

It is important to note that while the commercial and municipal side of the operation at Newburgh Transfer Station will be closed, residents will be able to still utilize the Citizens Drop-off Area to bring single stream recycling, paper, tires, electronics, scrap metal and municipal solid waste, as this portion of the facility will remain open during the project. 3. Remember, an adult will not need help from a child, do not listen to "I need help finding my kitten."
4. Know your name, phone number, and address.
5. If your child wanders off at the store, instruct them to go to the counter and announce they cannot find you. They should remain there until you locate them. Do not wander off.
6. Explain to them that no one is allowed to touch their body except for mommy and daddy if needed.
7. Always try to walk to and from school in groups.
8. Never post any of your personal contact information on social media networking sites.
9. Check with your parents before posting any pictures online.
10. Take interest in the internet sites your child visits and monitor their computer usage.

IF YOUR CHILD IS MISSING:

Contact police immediately, share a description of what they were wearing the day they went missing and provide the Child Identification Booklet. Request that your child's name be entered into the National Crime Information Center Missing Person File (NCIC), which allows any law enforcement agency in the U.S. to identify them.

The photo in this booklet should be updated every 6 months to a year. We hope that there is never a need to use this booklet with law enforcement, but in the sad event you may, every second counts and all the information contained in this booklet will increase your chances of recovering your child.

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) staff have reviewed the Town of Warwick's State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) Lead Agency coordination, including the Short Environmental Assessment Form (EAF), and plan entitled "Pulpit Rock Inn," sheet 1 of 1, dated 05/29/19. The project involves the construction of a 7,853-square-foot (sq. ft.) 62-unit hotel, six 2,236-sq.-ft. eight-unit cottages and other site improvements. The DEC has no objection to the Town assuming Lead Agency and we offer the following comments:

The Town has preliminarily determined that the proposed project is an 'Unlisted' action, however pursuant to 6 NYCRR Part 617.4(b)(8), "any unlisted action occurring wholly or partially within an agricultural district," is considered a 'Type 1' action. The project is located within Agricultural District 2 therefore, this project appears to be a 'Type 1' action and a Full EAF must be provided.

STATE POLLUTION DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (SPDES)

A SPDES permit is required for a facility whose treatment system has a design flow of total discharges to ground or surface waters of more than 1,000 gallons per day (gpd) of sewage-wastewater.

It appears that the overall project will disturb over one acre of land therefore, the project sponsor must obtain coverage under the current SPDES General Permit (GP-0-15-002) for Stormwater Discharge from Construction Activities, and a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) must be developed which conforms to requirements of the General Permit. As this site is within a Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) community, the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) must be reviewed and accepted by the municipality, and the MS4 Acceptance Form submitted with the SWPPP and the application for coverage, in accordance with the application instructions.



WATER WITHDRAWAL

Please note that an Article 15 Water Withdrawal permit may be required to undertake activities pursuant to 6NYCRR Part 601.6, such as the construction, operation and maintenance of a water withdrawal system. Please be aware that wells with the capacity to withdraw more than 100,000 gallons per day (gpd) is determined by the limiting maximum capacity of the water withdrawal system, and not the demand of the system (6NYCRR Part 601.6c). FRESHWATER WETLANDS

It appears that the subject property contains wetlands that are of size and quality to be eligible for inclusion on the state regulatory maps for Freshwater Wetlands. These wetlands need to be evaluated by a DEC biologist to determine if they are of sufficient size to be included on the state maps. In similar circumstances, the Department has worked with project sponsors to achieve an acceptable development consistent with the state regulatory permit standards (6 NYCRR Part 663) without being delayed by the formal process of adding a wetland to the state map.

It is unclear from the plan if the proposed project requires disturbance to the wetland. Please contact Michael Fraatz, NYSDEC Bureau of Ecosystem Health to schedule a site visit to confirm that the wetlands meet the criteria to be regulated and are accurately represented on the plans. After confirmation that the wetland meets the size criteria to be regulated, the Department can also discuss potential ways to minimize disturbance within 100 feet of the wetland. An Army Corps of Engineers permit may be required pursuant to Section 404 of the Clean Water Act. If a Section 404 permit is required, you will also require a Water Quality Certification pursuant to Section 401 of the Clean Water Act. Issuance of these certifications in NYS has been delegated to the DEC. Please contact the Army Corps of Engineers in New York City, at 917-790-8411, for any permitting they might require.

A Protection of Waters permit is required to physically disturb the bed or banks (up to 50 feet from stream) of any streams identified above as "protected." A time restriction may be required for protection of cold-water trout fisheries (waters classified under Article 15 of the Environmental Conservation Law (ECL) with a "T" or "TS" designation), beginning October 1 and ending April 30.

If a permit is not required, please note, the project sponsor is still responsible for ensuring that work shall not pollute any stream or waterbody. Care shall be taken to stabilize any disturbed areas promptly after construction, and all necessary precautions shall be taken to prevent contamination of the stream or waterbody by silt, sediment, fuels, solvents, lubricants, or any other pollutant associated with the project.

STATE-LISTED SPECIES

DEC has reviewed the State's Natural Heritage records. We have determined that the site is located within or near record(s) of the following state-listed species:

A permit is required for the incidental taking of any species identified as "endangered" or "threatened," which can include the removal of habitat. A time-of-year restriction, with all tree removal taking place between October 1st and December 31st, must be implemented.

Please note that a project sponsor may not commence site preparation, including tree clearing, until the provisions of SEQR are complied with and all necessary permits are issued for the proposed project.

The absence of data does not necessarily mean that rare or state-listed species, natural communities or other significant habitats do not exist on or adjacent to the proposed site. Rather, our files currently do not contain information which indicates their presence. For most sites, comprehensive field surveys have not been conducted. We cannot provide a definitive statement on the presence or absence of all rare or state-listed species or significant natural communities. Depending on the nature of the project and the conditions at the project site, further information from on-site surveys or other sources may be required to fully assess impacts on biological resources.

CULTURAL RESOURCES

We have reviewed the statewide inventory of archaeological resources maintained by the New York State Museum and the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation, and Historic Preservation. These records indicate that the project is located within an area considered to be sensitive with regard to archaeological resources. FEMA FLOODPLAIN

The project site is located within a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Floodplain. The Town of Warwick will determine if any additional jurisdictions are applicable to the proposal.

Also, regulations applicable to the location subject to this determination occasionally are revised and the project sponsor should, therefore, verify the need for permits if the project is delayed or postponed. This determination regarding the need for permits will remain effective for a maximum of one year. Dear Supervisor Sweeton,

Orange & Rockland Utilities will begin an important Gas Main Replacement Project in in the Town of Warwick on or about Monday, September 23, 2019 and I wanted provide you with some of the details.

This project is designed to strengthen and improve the reliability of the natural gas system. The project requires trenching 750' along Glenmere-Homesites Road and removing an existing gas regulator.

Our contractor, Titanic, will install new 2' PLX plastic main to replace the aging bare steel gas main. The project will also involve renewing 4 gas services and will require interrupting service to those customers as the new connections are made. All customers will be notified in advance for scheduling individual gas, outages.

The project is expected to be completed by October 1st and represents an investment by O&R of \$177.522 in the neighborhood's natural gas infrastructure.

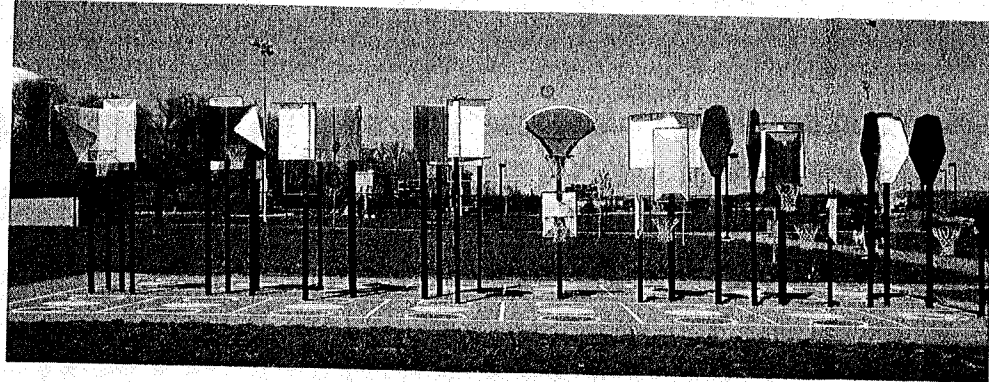

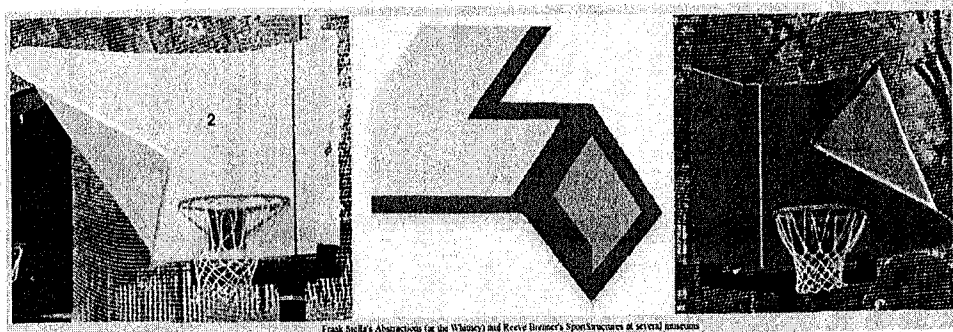

Sports Structures, Sculpture,
Bankboards, Calder, Picasso, Stella



The exuberant sense of play, merging the obvious aspects of art understood as form and function - itself a heady mixture - suggests to a visitor that Reeve Brenner's Bankshot Playcourt is something of the legendary logic of Abstract Impressionism's immersion into the world of sports.

Just imagine artists Paul Klee, Joan Miró and Wassily Kandinsky at a Bankshot Playcourt, with a basketball in their hands and seeing for the first time these striking geometries in bold inviting display. Also imagine famous sculptors Alexander Calder and Marcel Duchamp being asked to shoot a ball at these structures, which they inspired with whim and fancy. They might witness and bear testimony for themselves the transformation of art into the playful world of sports.

It would be what Frank Stella, an abstractionist artist, called "form" transforming into an inclusionary affordance he called "function." The functionality these sport structures present to children and adults, who have never heard of this art form, will perhaps only be seen as a sport's challenge. But form, when Bankshot structures are viewed alongside Frank Stella's work, is at once evident. Besides, children of all ages, sizes, shapes and diversity, including physically and cognitively challenged, and wheelchair users, participate together achieving real socialization and integration of the community within the world of art and play.

Bankshot's appearance provides a range of impetuously colored configurations, alternating with glowing abstract shapes and excursions relative to Picasso (when he was in his Cubist stage), Frank Stella's humongous-gigantic abstractionist structures (at the new Whitney Museum of American Art) and Alexander Calder's Stabiles. All the while participants are immersed in what Sports Illustrated, (in an article entitled the "Rabbi of Roundball"), referred to as an experience merging art with play: "With their odd shapes and bright colors, Brenner's bankboards have a surreal, futuristic look, like hoop saplings sprung from radioactive soil."

Although, for the most part, created at the Wingate Sports Institute outside of Netanya, the Israel National Museum in Jerusalem was the first international art museum, foreshadowing several others, to exhibit Bankshot as sports structures with the opportunity for play and participation. Available outdoor in the courtyard is a bin of basketballs in various sizes for visitors to choose from. Indoor, wall-hangings display Bankshot Bankboards merging art and play. Since then, the design department of The Museum of Modern Art in New York; the Boston children's Museum and the Bridgeport Connecticut Science Museum have placed Bankshot on permanent display indoors in space for that purpose. The Children's Museum of Memphis (CMOM) has begun construction of a Bank-around-the-circle Bankshot playcourt. Bankshot simultaneously art and

play constitutes a kind of spiritual union formed within the surrounding post-modern space conceived as universal design and set aside for the socialization and the integration of a community.

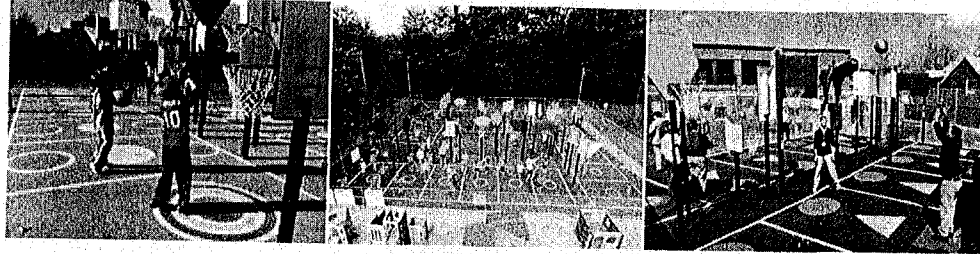
An important and novel aspect about Bankshot is its educational merit. The game offers an enriched play environment composed of a series of novel sport challenges that invigorate the brain with mind-nurturing play experiences. Bankshot's design is also intended to stimulate motor coordination in a dynamic kid-friendly, inclusionary game. Because of Bankshot's spatial relationships, particularly in geometrical composition and court design, the Bankshot court is part of a new genre in the art/play/think world of wonder. It combines creative and scientific elements to produce an advanced participatory art form for today's young person. Bankshot is pure physics: an exercise in translating science into action. (Florida Park & Recreation Quarterly)

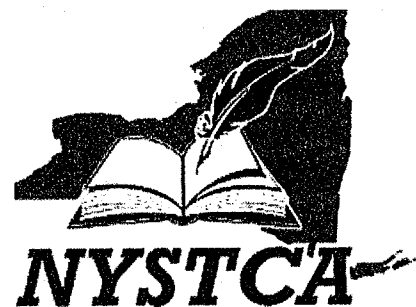

Marriage License Law

On August 20, 2019, the Governor passed a law waiving the State Fee on Marriage Licenses for Active Duty members of the Armed Forces.

The law does not define active duty. However, according to the Veteran's Administration, a person who is active duty is in the military full time. They work for the military full time, may live on a military base, and can be deployed at any time. Persons in the Reserve or National Guard are not full-time active duty military personnel, unless they are called up and deployed for service. They are considered active duty during the term of that service.

The law also does not state what type of documentation is required. Executive law section 354-d which allows the extension of the solemnization period for military personnel to 180 days states "Proof that the applicant is a member of the armed forces of the United States shall be furnished to the satisfaction of the official issuing the marriage license." This leaves the decision of what documentation you require up to you, as long as you are reasonable and apply the standard equally.

To document the fee waiver, we recommend that you Indicate "DRL 14a(4)" on the license. If the solemnization period is extended, also indicate "EXC 354(d)." When noting occupation on line 4A and/or 14A – enter Usual Occupation

followed by “* Active Military” (4A Accountant *Active Military -- 14A Dentist *Active Military).

Note, EXC 354(d) does not waive the 24-hour waiting period.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 3 of section 14-a of the domestic relations
2 law, as amended by chapter 297 of the laws of 1963, is amended to read
3 as follows:

4 3. a. No fee shall be charged for any certificate when required by the
5 veterans administration or by the division of veterans' affairs of the
6 state of New York to be used in determining the eligibility of any
7 person to participate in the benefits made available by the veterans
8 administration or by the state of New York.

9 b. A town or city may elect to waive the fee for a certificate when
10 either of the parties making application for such certificate is a
11 member of the armed forces of the United States on active duty.

12 § 2. Subdivision 4 of section 15 of the domestic relations law, as
13 amended by chapter 35 of the laws of 2017, is amended to read as
14 follows:

15 4. Before issuing any licenses herein provided for, the town or city
16 clerk shall be entitled to a fee of thirty dollars, which sum shall be
17 paid by the applicants before or at the time the license is issued;
18 provided, however, that when either of the parties applying for such
19 license is a member of the armed forces of the United States on active
20 duty (i) a town or city may not collect that portion of the fee which
21 would otherwise be transmitted to the state commissioner of health

1 pursuant to this subdivision and (ii) such town or city may elect to
2 waive the portion of the fee which the town or city is entitled to. Any
3 town or city clerk who shall issue a license to marry any persons one or

6 marriage to make such affidavits and statements or who shall not require
7 the production of documentary proof of age or the procuring of the
8 approval and consents provided for by this article, which shall show

11 thereof shall be fined in the sum of one hundred dollars for each and
12 every offense. On or before the fifteenth day of each month, each town

21 collected for the issuing of a marriage license, or for solemnizing a
22 marriage, so far as collected for services rendered by any officer or
23 employee of such city, shall be paid monthly into the city treasury and
24 may by ordinance be credited to any fund therein designated, and said
25 ordinance, when duly enacted, shall have the force of law in such city.
26 Notwithstanding any other provisions of this article, the clerk of any
27 city with the approval of the governing body of such city is hereby
28 authorized to designate, in writing filed in the city clerk's office, a
29 deputy clerk, if any, and/or other city employees in such office to

Dear Supervisor Sweeton and Town Board Members:

We request your approval of the proposed realignment of a drainage easement that is located on the property located at 6 Clark Street. The existing easement is shown on Filed Map #268-02 for the Wickham Lake Homes subdivision. Its purpose is to convey surface runoff to a stormwater detention basin located on an adjacent property.

A home is currently being constructed on the property. As shown on the enclosed plan prepared by Schmick Surveying Inc, a portion of the home is located within the existing drainage easement. We have discussed the situation with Laura Barca, Ben Astorino, and John Bollenbach. We have agreed on a way to remedy the situation by creating a new alignment for the easement, and abandoning the old alignment. The new alignment is also shown on the enclosed plan.

We have enclosed five copies of the plan, dated 9/20/19, for your review.
