**PRESENTATION:**

Megan Tennermann – Orange County Department of Planning – Thank you all very much for having me. Normally I am here in the capacity of the Planner for developments in the Town of Warwick, but here tonight I am here to talk to you wearing my demographic and census data analyst hat. I am the Demographic and Census Data Analyst for Orange County. What I am here to talk to you about tonight is the 2020 Census. As you all know the census comes around every 10 years, the year ending in zero. We started this in 1790 and we've done 24 of them so far and it still comes as some what of a shock, but here we are and it's 2020 and we plan on counting everybody in the country only once and in the right place. It is our hope that Orange County will get to a 100% count, but in the past, we've received an 85% response rate and we are going for a 100% response rate because there are a lot of things hanging in the balance this year. Among those things 681 billion dollars that is distributed annually by the federal government through 131 programs that are based entirely on population, decennial population to be specific. Our population count in 2020 will determine our level of funding at the State, at the County, at the Municipal level for the next 10 years and it's in Warwick's best interest that everyone gets out and gets counted. Additionally, a current population count is necessary for grants. Anything you need to pay for, for roadwork or public services, like maybe a new water plant and you need a grant to pay for it you will need an accurate population count. Besides the money let's talk about representation. The decennial census count also is used to determine representation in Washington, Albany and even in Goshen. The redistricting in process took place the last time around it was my job and I'm not looking forward to doing that again, but I will. Once the Legislative Districts for the County are set the State Legislative Districts are also set based on decennial population and New York, you might have heard is losing population. There are a lot of people going south to get away from snow and taxes and Cuomo's weird laws and so we are going to lose with the loss of population one seat in congress because we are at 27 now and we are going down to 26. The difference between us losing 1 seat in congress and 2 seats in congress is 65,000 people. That is the combined population of the

Town of Wallkill and the City of Middletown, not a lot, so it is very important that everybody in Orange County gets out and gets counted. Mike, I bet you know the third reason that we need to be incredibly concerned about getting a fair population, your share of sales tax is based on the town's population. You want to get as much of that money as you are entitled to. Why am I spewing statistics at you, you ask? I'm doing this because I want you trusted members of your community elected by the people to get out there and talk to people. I want you to make this your most boring message as I have done for the last 6 months. I want you to talk to everybody in the Town of Warwick and get them to take their census. You can do it online starting today and do it up until Census Day which is April 1<sup>st</sup>. People will be receiving in the mail and I see a gentleman nodding, I bet you got one today an envelope from the United States Census Bureau. It will be addressed to 123 Main Street and in that envelope will be a code that is specific to your residence. This code can be used to go online and take the census right away and once you do it you're done or the mailer has information how you can respond over the telephone, including services for the deaf, hearing impaired or for those who are visually impaired. It also includes information on how to get a paper form, should you not want to put your information out there over the phone or the internet. It is perfectly fine to request a form and respond by the mail, no problem. Between now and about May 15<sup>th</sup> you are going to get a series of 4 mailers, the first is the information to take the census and the other mailers will be reminders to take the census. Please do so, because starting May 15<sup>th</sup> and going all the way up to July 31<sup>st</sup> if you don't response, which classes for them a low response community that requires a lot more people. If you do not respond by mail, by phone, by internet then you are going to get up to 6 visits from a person or a couple of people called Census Enumerators. These are mostly young enthusiastic people who will come and knock on your door and they will have you fill out the census right then and there on a touch pad that lots of people have touched and as we have the corona virus going on and it's still cold and flu season, I'm guessing you don't want to have any long term contact with people or devices if you don't have to. Your best bet is to go online today and fill it out, even if you have not received your envelope yet you can go online and put in your address and that will take care of it. Responses are limited to one per household, so if you do it and your wife does it the second one is going to be discarded as being incorrect. This is in attempt to cut down on false information. If somebody wants to do a prank and put in information that is blatantly false the census bureau will look at it and it will be discarded and the response will be gathered by the enumerator. That is how you take the census, what's on the census, they are going to ask your name, the names of all the people living in the house, the ages of all the people living in the house, race and ethnicity, genders and how you are all related to each other. That's it, they are not going to ask you about your political beliefs or how many rooms are in your house, or how many cars you own, what time you leave for work, or how much money you make or anything else. They are not going to ask for your social security number, your bank information, your credit card numbers or money in any form. If any of that happens in person or in a mailer that is not a representative of the census bureau and you should call the police. Anyone who comes to your house on behalf of the Census Bureau is going to have an ID badge with the Census Bureau logo on it, has a picture of the person holding it, and has that person's name and an expiration date, so check their ID. If they don't have an ID, it's a scam, don't let them in and call the police. The census is easy, how about safe. Your information is protected for 72 years by Title 13 of the United States Code. Any violation of Title 13 which would be limited to less than 1,000 census

bureau employees are going to see everyone's raw information. So, if one of those less than 1,000 employees reveals your personal information or each person whose information is compromised that is a count in violation which comes with up to 5 years in prison and up to a \$250,000 fine. I told you the questions you will be asked and most people put more on their Facebook profile, I can guarantee. The census is safe and the census is easy, again it is absolutely vital that Warwick has a full count in order to get full representation, your full share of sales tax and your full share of federal funding. Every person in 2010 that did not get counted cost Orange County \$2,500 per year, so per person who did not respond per year \$2,500 and that is highway funding, school funding and that is all kinds of programs that are absolutely vital and that we have to pay for anyway, so why don't we get the federal funding that we're entitled to. What I am asking the Board to do is talk to absolutely everybody and make yourself a bore and see if they've done their census or not. I very much considered having you all pull out your smartphones and do it right now. I also if you have a nonemergency text line that you use for things like water main breaks or parade announcements or things like that, please put out there the announcement about the census. I will have materials emailed to you tomorrow morning in English and Spanish and wires that are geared towards businesses, people who are elderly, disabled or homebound and who are more likely to be preyed upon for scam and parents of young children because for whatever reason children from the ages of 0-4 are one of the least counted groups. Actually, it is the highest undercounted demographic group. In 2010 4.6% of that age group are undercounted and that's a million kids nationally, that weren't accounted for in school buildings and long term budgeting and that stuff. If you can use your nonemergency lines, if you can put out your brochures and fliers and make sure they get to where they need to go, put information on your website, please just get the word out as much as you can.

Supervisor Sweeton – We will be happy to do that. Thank you for your presentation, good job.

Ryan Denisco – Orange County Planning Department - How many languages does the form come in?

Megan Tennermann – The form does come in 13 different languages and those are available on the phone should you want to fill out your form over the phone. In addition to English. If you have a large Spanish speaking population you can also get an enumerator who is a native Spanish speaker. I know that's a concern for the Ag folks so that is something that we make sure comes to Warwick. If you had a large mandarin or Kreyol speaking population we could get that too.

Councilman Gerstner – Is there any funds for advertising?

Megan Tennermann – Sort of, New York State has made some money available through an entitlement grant and that is supposed to be awarded to the County. Then the County will pass that along to 75% of to nonprofits that work with large scale populations. A portion of that is going to be retained by the County and that is going to be used for advertising for digital boards, Facebook ads, TV ads, radio, a lot of things are going to be made available

through that. We will be happy to give the Town of Warwick whatever materials they need for advertising.

Supervisor Sweeton – Thank you Megan we appreciate it. Fill out your census when you get home tonight.

Vincent Copello- Chairman, Town of Warwick Friendly Visitor Program – This is the January and February reports for 2020. If I look at the totals from January and February of last year 2019 overall it's a 23% increase. So again the program is doing well. There's one item here that you'll see the total number of services provided by the volunteers in January it was 345 and in February it was 162. The reason why that number went down the Jewish Family Services that does all the calculations for this program revised their calculation. What they were doing with the services is if they had a service for someone to take them someplace and back they counted that as two instead of one. That is why you see that it's half of what January was. The program is doing really well and it's probably going to expand between now and the end of the year. I would anticipate by the end of the year having well over 200 and close to 250 in this program and well over 100 volunteers. they sound like big numbers but we have 8,000 seniors in the Town of Warwick.

## **COUNCILMAN DE ANGELO REPORT**

1. The Post Report for February 2020 is as follows: Greenwood Lake had 135 calls, the Town outside the Village had 484 calls, Pine Island had 189 calls, the Village of Warwick had 362 calls and the Greenwood Lake Fire District had 32 calls for a total of 1,202 for the month of February.

2. The Warwick Valley Humane Society the current shelter list is 23 dogs, 60 adult cats, 7 kittens, 6 rabbits, 2 roosters and 1 mouse for a total of 99 animals that are open for adoption. They did have a rooster that was adopted with his harem of 7 hens and they found a forever home.

3. They have a very urgent need with so many dogs to feed they are in need of Diamond Naturals chicken or beef canned food. The other things on their wish list are paper towels, canned pate style cat food, bleach, dish detergent, medium exam gloves and Science Diet Dry cat and dog food.

4. Just a reminder that all dogs must be licensed in the Town of Warwick through the Town Clerk's office on a yearly basis. Proof of current rabies vaccination and spay/neuter certificate are both required for licensing. Licensing is the only accepted proof of ownership in New York State at this time.

5. The Town of Warwick ordinance leash law is enforced by the Animal Control Officers. Any unleashed loose dog not on their own property is subject to seizure and impoundment at the Warwick Animal Shelter and can be redeemed with proof of current license and rabies vaccination with payment of the fees set by the Town of Warwick. This law protects the dog as well as prevents accidents and incidents related to the loose dog. If one of your neighbors has a loose dog and it bites you an Animal Control Officer can seize that dog.

6. Suzyn Barron the President of the Warwick Humane Society is here tonight with Roscoe who is available for adoption.

Suzyn Barron – President, Warwick Valley Humane Society – Roscoe is a 1-year old American Bully bread mix, so he almost looks like an English Staffordshire but doesn't have any English in him. A lot of people don't understand how we get the animals here at the shelter, especially when it comes to dogs. There are a couple of ways we get them in, one way is from loose dogs and I would say 2/3 of the time they are returned to their owners. Other times they are seizure orders, they are animals that are given up by people and then there are situations like Roscoe who we were called out by the Police Department because they were doing a welfare check and he was one of the creatures in the house and because there wasn't an adult in the home we were asked to take the dog into custody. The owner was notified that we had the dog and that he was here for safe keeping and they decided that they weren't able to care for him anymore, so they surrendered him to us. He is looking for a home and he is only 1-year old and he is a typical bulldog/mix which means he has some skin issues that we are trying to get under control. He is very friendly as you can see, he's great with kids and he actually went to one of the elementary schools and I told my Animal Control Officer to have the kids come up one at a time, but Roscoe wasn't going to have that. He went and met them all at once and just laid on his back and let them give him belly rubs. He should probably be the only dog in the home because he tends to be a little more dominant, but he's ok to meet other dogs on the street, he's fine with that.

Roscoe is looking for a home and we are looking for a home for him and I thank you for letting him be here tonight.

Supervisor Sweeton – Presented Suzyn Barron with a proclamation stating that April is Prevention of Animal Cruelty Month. He also thanked her for all that they do at the Shelter to take care of our furry friends. The shelter is also trying to create a new home and they are still trying to raise money and funds for that, so if you have any spare change and you can help them, they welcome that.

Supervisor Sweeton – Just a comment on the bid proposals for the emergency plumbing and electric, this is a requirement of the Department of Labor starting to clamp down that any service a municipality engages should be a bid. It really does hamper our ability because you see we get no bids to get emergency work done, so it's kind of problematic and we are going to continue to try and abide by their rules and regulations. It's just a layer of bureaucracy that actually hampers the municipality to get things done, it's really kind of silly. Thank you for your report.

## **SUPERVISORS REPORT**

1. The Community Preservation fund receipts for the month of February are \$69,957.34 which brings the total to \$3,811,645.02. Another good month.

2. Kutz Camp Update- We are expecting the appraisal any day. We did do some continual inspections. Commissioner Astorino brought some outside electrical and plumbing contractors there and the Building Department went back again. The facility is in fine shape in terms of its continued workability. Some of the plumbing fixtures are a little older but it's normal wear and tear so we still feel confident that we are getting a good value there and hopefully the appraisal will support that and we can move forward with that acquisition.

3. Corona Virus Update – So again obviously that is all that is in the news. We are trying to take a Be Calm approach about this and not get all caught up in the hysteria because we deal with these kinds of things from time to time. Common sense things are being recommended. Wash your hands often, don't touch your mouth and face, if you are sick, stay home and don't go where there are large crowds. We have been on several calls with the County and what they are recommending is that Senior groups that meet here at Town Hall, don't meet. They have agreed. It makes sense. Our transportation system is cleaning our buses everyday so that the residents that do need to use that service will feel comfortable. Around Town Hall we have hand sanitizing capabilities for people if they come to visit. The Clerk's office is doing a great job. The Clerk has been going through the building multiple times every day cleaning and disinfecting the common touch points. But life goes on and we are asking people to just use common sense and don't get carried away in all of this. Reports of things flying off the shelves in stores it's really kind of crazy. So, we will be in touch and if it gets worse, we will certainly take action. There are no canceling things at this point. You heard some organizations are limiting large gatherings. That is what the County is recommending and that's fine but your daily interactions you need to do those things and we will keep everyone informed on Facebook and we do have the capability to send out a phone message if necessary. We just want people to carry on and just be careful.
